

Application Guidelines: Japanese Program Scholarship for Research in Japan

Application for the scholarship should include the following:

1. The application form
2. A description of your project (2–3 pages, typed, double spaced) including its short term (for the summer) and long term objectives
3. A budget, including costs of travel, lodging and meals
4. A statement of support from a faculty member who will supervise the project
5. An official Duke transcript
6. Please note that grant recipients working with human subjects will need a check with the Office of Research Support to see if their project needs IRB approval. See <http://www.ors.duke.edu/undergraduate-research> for information.
